## One Health

The One Health Graduate Certificate is based on the 'One Health' concept that interactions among people, animals, and the environment can profoundly influence health outcomes through increased disease risk and pathogen transmission. While human-animal-environmental interactions have long been recognized as being important, some powerful drivers of change are increasingly causing volatility among these linkages. For example, the influence of climate change has caused the emergence and re-emergence of many diseases.

This certificate prepares individuals to educate and inform people about One Health and those factors that influence interactions between humans, animals, and the environment.
