#	Criterion	Description	Points (Scale)
1	Introduction	concise; announced topic; covered relevant background; explained existing gap in knowledge; stated purpose/objective of study	scale 1-5
2	Methods	sufficient detail provided to understand how study was conducted (but not overly detailed or time consuming)	scale 1-10
3	Results and Discussion	clear and concise; important patterns or trends emphasized; results placed clearly in the context of previous work and provided advancement of knowledge	scale 1-10
4	Conclusion	clear and concise summation and elevation of important points and relevance (but not a repeat of results and discussion)	scale 1-5
5	Manner of Presentation	looked mostly at the audience; good volume, not monotone; appropriate rate; minimal distracting fillers (e.g., um, uh, you know, like) or mannerisms; appropriate dress; did not go over allotted time	scale 1-10
6	Visual Aids	well-designed; appropriate font (easy to read and sufficiently large); figures and tables with appropriate information; integrated well into presentation	scale 1-10
